MANAGEMENT EXPERIENCE

- Assumed the management of the internationalization of Széchenyi István University in September 2017.
- Apart from the 200 Hungarian-taught degree programmes, our University offers 38 English-taught programmes.
- The number of English-taught programmes has increased nearly eightfold and the number of international students has increased sixfold since 2017.
- Our international student body, representing 10% of total number of students, originates from 77 nations.
- For the 2023/2024 academic year, the number of self-financed students admitted for our English-taught programmes exceeded the number of Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship students for the first time.
- Széchenyi István University has been ranked in the QS World University Rankings since 2021, and in the year 2024 we were listed in position #1001-1200.
- On the THE Impact Rankings, where we are listed since 2020, we have been ranked #300 in SDG 8, 11 and 16.
- For 2024, our University has been listed on both THE's World University Rankings at position #1501+ as well as on THE's WUR by Subject - Engineering.
